SUMMARY OF UPDATES



ST. KITTS AND NEVIS: NATIONAL DISASTER MANAGEMENT AGENCY (NEMA)

- > Intermittent showers and thunderstorms experienced.
- No infrastructure damage was reported.
- Due to choppy seas, interisland transport have ceased operations.

SAINT LUCIA: NATIONAL EMERGENCY MANAGEMENT ORGANIZATION (NEMO)

- > The Saint Lucia Meteorological Office issued a discontinuation of the Tropical Storm Warning for Saint Lucia.
- District Disaster Committees namely: Castries East, Vieux Fort South, Dennery, Castries North, and Anse La Raye reported that there were no damages or injuries in the respective districts.
- The two (2) open shelters in Anse La Raye recorded receiving eight (8) persons. Registered persons have returned to their homes.
- The Saint Lucia Air and Sea Ports Authority (SLASPA) indicated that the Airport and Sea port infrastructure on the island resumed normal operations at 11:00 AM on August 27, 2019.
- Ministry of Health reported that the Hospitals and Wellness Centres had not sustained damages. Hospitals are open for services. Wellness centres resumed operations at 12 noon on August 27, 2019.
- The Ministry of the Public Service have informed of resumption of the services of government offices from 12 noon on August 27, 2019.
- > The Vieux Fort Emergency Operation Centre reported shut-down of operation at 11:00 AM on August 27, 2019.
- The National Emergency Operation Centre (NEOC) conducted an after action assessment of operations at 11:00 AM on August 27, 2019, and was subsequently shut down at 11:15 AM on August 27, 2019.



DOMINICA: OFFICE OF DISASTER MANAGEMENT (ODM)

> CDEMA, CIMH, and Dominica Meteorological Office convened a meeting to discuss the landslide and flash flooding threats on August 27, 2019.

- > On August 28, 2019, ODM reported no significant damages as a result of the heavy rains.
- > Emergency operations have been stood down.

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ST. VINCENT AND THE GRENADINES: NATIONAL EMERGENCY MANAGEMENT ORGANIZATION

- The Tropical Storm Warning for St. Vincent and the Grenadines was discontinued at 11:00AM on Tuesday August 27, 2019.
- The Government of St. Vincent and the Grenadines issues the ALL Clear at 11:00AM on Tuesday August 27, 2019.
- > Two (2) landslides were reported, however there were no reports of damage to property or infrastructure.
- Fifteen emergency shelters were activated with a total of one hundred and fifty seven (157) shelterees.
- Seventy-five (75) residents of the Louise Punnett Home (Elderly Home) were relocated to the emergency shelter at Fair Hall Primary School. They were returned to the home on Tuesday evening.
- > All shelters were confirmed closed as of 2:00 PM Tuesday August 27, 2019.
- > The National Emergency Operations Centre (NEOC) was deactivated at 11:00AM on August 27, 2019.

Caribbean Disaster Emergency Management Agency (CDEMA) Actions

- The Regional Coordination Plan (RCP) remains activated (as at August 28, 2019)
- The Regional Response Teams remain on ALERT: (CARICOM Disaster Assessment and Coordination (CDAC), CARICOM
 Operational Support Team (COST), Rapid Needs Assessment Team (RNAT), the Multi-National Civil Military Coordination Cell
 (MNCCC) and the CARICOM Disaster Relief Unit (CDRU). CDAC and RNAT.
- CDEMA and the UN Resident Coordinator co-chaired the fourth meeting of the Regional Response Mechanism Partners -Caribbean Development Partners Group - Disaster Management (CDPG DM), at 1:00 PM today, August 28, 2019 at the CDEMA CU in Lower Estate, St. Michael, Barbados. The Caribbean Institute for Meteorology and Hydrology (CIMH) provided a brief to this meeting.
- CDEMA CU urges all Participating States and members of the Regional Response Mechanism (RRM) to continue to monitor the progress of this system as it tracks on to the northwestern Caribbean States.
